

Interview Subject Release Form

Whenever a writer or researcher formally records an interview with another person, the writer should obtain legal permission from the person to transcribe and use the entire interview. Students in Dr. Hepworth's class may modify the following sample form to suit their purposes. The final version of the form, of course, will depend on the nature of the interview. Here the form applies primarily to recording a video interview that will be transcribed.
